

Steel Stoves tend to be the simplest in terms of design, both aesthetically and functionally. Steel stoves are typically less expensive than the other types. Nevertheless good quality steel stoves are durable and efficient.

Cast Iron Stove designs are typically more complex and aesthetically pleasing. The best ones are beautiful, efficient and will last a lifetime.

Freestanding Stoves are generally straightforward to install because a floor pad is simply laid down they are placed on it. The problem is that they take up a lot of space and you see everything.... the outside air kit, the chimney, etc.

The Built-In-Stove Advantage

Built-In-Stoves can be configured with ductwork and fans to heat other rooms. Some models will even heat rooms below the fireplace. Freestanding stoves can't do that.

Built-In-Stoves take up less space. A typical Built-In-Stove projects just 2' into the room; a typical freestanding stove about 3', plus the hearth.

While Built-In-Stoves often cost more than freestanding models, a large portion of this cost comes from the installation of facing materials like stone, brick, slate or marble. The "stove" disappears and the fire becomes the focus of a beautiful wall, designed to compliment your home.

A fireplace is one of the most sought after features in a home and will increase its resale value much more than a freestanding stove. A Built-In-Stove gives you the best of both worlds.
